This Installation Guide provides the steps required to install and configure the Makito X1 Rugged Video Encoder to stream to your compatible decoding device. This guide covers the Makito X1 appliance (#S-MX1E-R-SDI1-ISR) and the Evaluation Kit (#S-MX1E-R-SDI1-DK, available upon request at sales@haivision.com)

Please refer to the Makito X1 Rugged Encoder User's Guide for detailed configuration and operation information, as well as technical specifications.

We recommend that you familiarize yourself with this guide before installing your encoder.

The Makito X1 Rugged is an ultra-compact H.265/HEVC and H.264/AVC low latency encoder for real-time streaming of MISB/JITC-compliant full motion video in demanding Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance (ISR) environments.

Makito X1 Rugged features include the following:

• **HEVC Encoding** – With dual encoding cores, the Makito X1 Rugged can encode HD 1080p60 or SD with H.265/HEVC and H.264/AVC compression simultaneously. On the first encoder (only), it offers independent control of scaling, cropping, and encoding parameters. It also supports Network Adaptive Encoding to provide quality streams even when network bandwidth is variable or unpredictable, for example, over constrained IP networks, line-of-sight (LOS) and satellite links.

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- Small Form Factor, Powerful Encoding The Makito X1 Rugged is a portable, SWaP- (Size, Weight, and Power)-optimized video encoder available as a hardened appliance or OEM board for advanced integrations.
 - The appliance is designed for deployment in portable man-wearable equipment or small platforms in harsh environments.
 - The OEM board is suited for deep integration within ISR sensor, datalink, or mission systems.
- Ultra Low Latency for ISR and Situational Awareness The Makito X1 Rugged streams high-quality full-motion video at low encoding latencies suitable for the most demanding ISR applications. It ensures excellent picture quality at low bit rates to address the real-time requirements for air, ground, manned or unmanned platforms.
- Compliant Encoding with KLV Metadata from Haivision The Makito X1 Rugged complies
 with MISB/STANAG specifications for encoding and KLV metadata. It supports selective filtering of
 KLV metadata parameters to ensure downstream interoperability with exploitation systems and
 cross-domain applications. It provides the flexibility to combine H.265/HEVC and H.264/AVC
 encoded video with synchronous or asynchronous KLV metadata and optimizes streaming
 bandwidth.

Getting Started

- 1. Unpack the box and visually inspect the package contents for any evidence of shipping damage. See the *Important Notice* document in the box for a list of contents.
- 2. In addition to the contents of the box, you may need to have the following items available:
 - Four #8-32 or M4 screws for mounting (not included)
 - Haivision cabling kits (p/n CA-MX1E-R-TERM) or your own custom cables (see Makito X1 Rugged Encoder Pinouts)
 - A laptop with Web browser, Telnet client, and video player (e.g., VLC)
- 3. To view the output from the encoder, make sure you have a decoding device or video player that supports the UDP Transport Stream format.

Note

If the device is to be installed in a remote location (e.g., on a utility pole, or on a mobile platform), we recommend that you follow the instructions in this Installation Guide to perform an initial setup in a "staging" environment, such as a lab or control center. Once the device has been set up and is demonstrated to be operating normally, you can then move it to the remote location.

Caution

Before installing the device, please refer to Safety Guidelines. Only connect the unit to a compatible power source. If an electrical fault occurs, disconnect the unit and contact Haivision Technical Support. Never try to force the connections when setting up the system as this may damage the unit.

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Caution

Hot surface. Avoid contact. The chassis can achieve a surface temperature 95°C in poorly ventilated environments, and may cause personal injury if touched. Ensure adequate thermal management (cooling).

Installing the Makito X1 Rugged Encoder

Always read the instructions carefully and keep this guide for future reference.


To install the appliance:

1.

Caution

The surface temperature of the chassis can reach 95°C in poorly ventilated environments. We recommend that you fasten the appliance to a metal (cold) plate to increase heat dissipation. In add cases, adequate temperature management is required to dissipate 6 Watts of power continuously.

- 2. Fasten the appliance to its support base with four screws (size M2.5 or 4-40, not included). Or you can use two stainless steel, harsh-environment cable ties (up to 250 mils wide), which can be passed through slots in the chassis.
- 3. Fasten a grounding wire (10 AWG minimum) to the grounding lug using the screw and lock washer provided.





Caution

The chassis must be properly grounded in order to provide protection against lightning strikes and other power surges.

The Makito X1 Rugged enclosure provides the following rugged connectors:

- Power & I/O connector combining these inputs:
 - **Power** (+5VDC, < 6 W)
 - Analog Audio (Future use) Two (2) channels of analog audio 33 Kohms input impedance)
 - **Serial** Port (RS-232/422 can be used for Management, Pass-thru or KLV or CoT metadata ingest)
- CVBS/SDI connector 75 Ω BNC (used for either SD-SDI (Serial Digital Interface), HD-SDI video, or Composite (CVBS) input signals, with format auto-detected)
- Network connector 10/100/1000 Base-T Gigabit Ethernet; connector also includes a Reset line


The BNC connector is also a 3G-SDI capable interface supporting 1080p 50/60 fps video @ 3Gbps. In addition, it supports auto-detection of the HD resolution and embedded digital audio.

The Ethernet/Factory Reset and Power/Audio/Serial breakout cables (shown in the following steps) are shipped as part of the Evaluation Kit (#S-MX1E-R-SDI1-DK).


To connect the encoder to the network and A/V sources:

- 1. Remove the protective caps from the encoder's connectors.
- 2. Connect the encoder's **Network** port to the IP network using the **Ethernet/Factory Reset** breakout cable (shown following):





- 3. Connect the encoder's CVBS/SDI video input to your video source, referring to the above image.
- 4. (Optional) Connect the encoder's **DC In & I/O** port to your audio source(s) using the **Power/Audio/ Serial** breakout cable (shown following).



5. (Optional) If you have a KLV or CoT source that uses RS-232 or RS-422, connect the encoder's **DC** In & I/O port to the metadata source or to the serial port of a computer using the power/audio/serial breakout cable.

The **DC In & I/O** port may be used to ingest KLV/CoT, as a management port or as pass-thru for camera control.



Note

The Reset button provides two options:

- If you press and hold the button for less than 4 seconds, the system resets and loads the last saved "startup" configuration. If no configuration was previously saved as the startup preset, the default settings prevail.
- If you press and hold the button for more than 4 seconds, the module performs a complete factory reset. It clears all of the previously configured settings, including IP, streams and encoder configurations.
- 6. (Optional) To capture analog audio, connect the encoder's Audio/Serial connector to your audio source(s) using the the audio/serial breakout cable, shown in the previous step.



Note

As of Release 1.1.1, the Makito X1 Rugged supports two (2) input channels of analog audio. To configure analog audio, see Set Up a Test Stream.

Powering up the Makito X1 Encoder

There is no power switch on the encoder. The power is automatically on when the unit is plugged in.



To power up the encoder:

1. (As shown under Connecting to the Network and Audio/Video Sources) Insert the Power/Audio/ Serial breakout cable connector into the encoder's the encoder's power input port (DC In & I/O). Both AC and DC power cables (shown following) are shipped as part of the Evaluation Kit (#S-MX1E-R-SDI1-DK).

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- 2. Make sure the connector is properly inserted and locked to avoid intermittent power problems.
- 3. Connect the power cable to a +5V power source. (The AC PSU can be used to convert from 120V AC to 5VDC ±.25V.)
 - The Status LED next to the video input will start blinking green, indicating that the encoder is booting up.
- 4. Wait until the Status LED stays solid green, indicating that the encoder is ready for operation.

Accessing the Web Interface

- 1. Open a Web browser of your choice, such as Chrome, Firefox, Safari, or Internet Explorer.
- 2. Type the IP address for the encoder into the browser's address bar and press Enter. The Makito X1 comes pre-configured with the following default settings:

Note

To access the Web interface, your computer must be in the same IP Address range (subnet). You may have to temporarily change your computer's IP Address to be in the same subnet as the encoder. Only then will you be able to access the encoder and change its IP address, and then afterwards change your computer's IP address back. For details, see Configuring Network Settings in the User's Guide.


3. The first time you try to access the Web interface from a new browser, the browser may not recognize the encoder's https connection, and you may get a Security Certificate Warning (such as "This Connection is Untrusted." or "The site's security certificate is not trusted."). You must accept the encoder's self-signed certificate in order to access the Web interface.



Note

The Makito X1 identity certificate and trusted root certificates may be managed from the Web interface (Certificates page) or using the CLI certificate command. See Managing Certificates in the User's Guide.

4. Sign in to the Web interface, using the default administrative username and password.



Please refer to the *Important Notice* (postcard included in the box or available from the Download Center on the Haivision Support Portal) for the default sign-in credentials.




(i) Important

Makito X Series devices ship from the factory with only the admin account enabled. For security reasons, the two default user accounts (user and operator) are locked at the factory as well as after a factory reset. An administrator must unlock them and change the passwords to use them for the first time.

Tip

For security purposes, be sure to change the default passwords! See Changing Your Password in the User's Guide.

The Web interface opens to the Outputs List View.




Setting Up a Test Stream

Setting up a test stream requires that you have an active video source connected to the Makito X1 Encoder. You will need to configure an encoding instance based on your video source, and then configure an output stream for that encoder. For detailed information, refer to Configuring Video Encoders and Configuring Streaming Outputs (in the User's Guide).

To configure an encoding instance:


1. Click **Video Encoders** on the sidebar. The Video Encoders List View opens.





2. Click a link in the table to select the encoder.

The Video Encoder Detail View opens, displaying the settings for the selected video encoder.




- 3. To configure the encoder, select or enter the new value(s) in the appropriate fields (see Configuring Video Encoders in the User's Guide).
- 4. Click Start, and then click Apply.




To configure an output stream:

Click **Outputs** on the sidebar.
 The Output Streams List View opens.





2. To add an output stream, click the • Add button. The New Stream page opens.




- 3. Under Content, type a Name for the stream, and under Source, select the encoder you started in **Step #4** (above).
- 4. Under Broadcasting, select **TS over UDP** for the Protocol.
- 5. Under Destination, type in a valid multicast Address (e.g., 239.192.2.3) and Port number (e.g., 2000).

Note

The Multicast address range is from 224.0.0.0 to 239.255.255.255. Multicast addresses from 224.0.0.0 to 224.0.0.255 are reserved for multicast maintenance protocols and should not be used by streaming sessions. We recommend that you use a multicast address from the Organization-Local scope (239.192.0.0/14).



6. To add metadata to the stream, select the Metadata source, and (optionally) select the encapsulation type (Data Carriage).



7. To apply your changes and start streaming, click **Apply**.



The changes will take effect immediately but will be lost after a reboot. For information on saving configuration settings, refer to Saving and Loading Presets in the User's Guide.

General Guidelines

- 1. Make sure your decoding device (or software) supports MPEG Transport Stream format.
- 2. Turn the device on and connect it to a display (if applicable), or open your video player software (e.g., VLC).
- 3. Make sure you are on the same network segment as the encoder.
- 4. Tune your decoding device or software to the multicast address of the test stream coming from the encoder.

Streaming to VLC Player

The following steps show how to validate a video streaming setup using VLC as a video decoder. VLC can be operated on a Windows or Linux machine. The following example uses a Windows machine but all the steps can easily be executed on a Linux machine.



Note


Unless otherwise specified, references to the "Makito X Series" or "Makito X" can be taken to include the Makito X, Makito X4, and Makito X1 family of encoders and decoders.

First, configure the encoder (see Setting Up a Test Stream).

Then set up VLC to decode the stream (as shown in the following procedure). This will validate your setup.


- 1. Connect the PC with VLC on the same network as the Makito X Series Encoder. Note the IP address
- 2. On the Serial connector or through an SSH connection, create a stream from the Makito X encoder to the PC.
 - For example: stream create addr={IP of the pc with VLC} port=2000 videosrc=0
- 3. Once the stream is created, you can validate that the encoder has started encoding by executing either of the following commands:
 - "stream all get table" or "videnc all get table"
- 4. On the PC, open VLC and under the "Media" tab, select "Open Network Stream...".





5. Under "Please enter a network URL:", enter "udp://@:2000" and click Play.

The stream should start within seconds. In case of failure, replace the "@" by the actual IP address of the PC.





6. Repeat Steps #2 and #3 to create a stream from HD Video Encoder 2. The only difference is on the Serial or SSH connection.

Enter the following command: #stream create addr={IP of the pc with VLC} port=2200 videosrc=2



Note

When changing the video input resolution on the encoder, you may need to re-initialize VLC to show the stream.

Resetting the Encoder

• Default Network Settings

This section describes the steps to perform a hardware reset on the Makito X1. The Reset button (located on the Ethernet/Factory Reset cable) is used either to reset the system or to restore the factory default settings.

- **System Reset:** In some cases, if your encoder is experiencing a problem, resetting the system can return the encoder to normal operation.
- Factory Reset: If the problem remains after performing a reset, it may help to restore the encoder to its factory default settings. A factory reset returns the encoder to the same settings it originally had when shipped from Haivision, including the factory default IP address, subnet, and gateway.



After a factory reset, only the firmware revision, serial number, and MAC address are preserved. All other data is deleted (including saved presets, added user accounts, modified passwords, and encoding settings). All settings are returned to their factory preset conditions (including the IP address).

Use one of the following methods to either reset or restore the encoder settings:

- 1. With the encoder on, press the button labeled **Reset** on the Ethernet/Factory Reset cable.
- 2. **System Reset:** Press the switch (you will feel the button depress) for at least one second and release. Be sure to release the button in less than five (5) seconds.
 - Factory Reset: Press and hold the switch for five (5) seconds.
- 3. Wait for the encoder to reboot. As soon as the lights stop blinking and the Status LED is solid green, the encoder is ready.




Note

The COM1 pins are DTE (Data Terminal Equipment) which defines the direction of the signals (IN/OUT).

The COM1 pins are configured by default for Metadata mode but may be switched to Management mode (to connect to a computer for management of the encoder) using the metadata CLI command. The metadata command may also be used to select the transceiver mode for the metadata capture (i.e., RS-232 or RS-422). For details, see metadata in the Makito X1 Rugged Encoder User's Guide.



Video Input Connector

The Makito X1 Rugged video encoder supports a single video input. The port marked CVBS/SDI can support up to 3G-SDI or analog video (NTSC/PAL).

- SDI is governed by SMPTE 259M (SD-SDI), 292M (HD-SDI) and 424M (3G-SDI) standards. Each coaxial pin is 75ohm impedance (3-GHz bandwidth).

The requirements for external cable assemblies are as follows (assuming the customer wants to avoid water immersion on them):

BNC Coaxial Cable Assemblies

The cable assemblies must be waterproof. We recommend using waterproof compression type BNC connectors for better reliability and mechanical properties. We suggest use of a connector such as the Belden p/n FSNS6BNCU with a cable retention force of 40 lbs. per SCTE IPS SP401.

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The input impedance must be 75 Ohms.

We recommend that you keep the protective cap on any unused video connectors.

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
